## UPPER TOWNSHIP SCHOOL DISTRICT RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Governor of New Jersey has a goal for expanding public preschool; and,

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey has allocated preschool funding public schools having more than ten percent of its student population as qualified for free and reduced lunch; and,

WHEREAS, the calculation for our K-8 District is calculated in such a way that our former students attending other districts 9-12 are also included in this calculation; and,

WHEREAS, our free and reduced calculation K-8 is above ten-percent (10%); and,

WHEREAS, the percentage decreases to less than ten-percent (10%) when those out of district 9-12 students are included; and,

WHEREAS, the Upper Township School District is an S-2 district where state aid has been cut more than four million dollars in the past five years; and,

WHEREAS, the district must reduce costs; and,

WHEREAS, our preschool program runs a deficit of \$165,727 with three sections, comprised of 49 students; and,

WHEREAS, our annual waiting list for preschool runs at 20-25 applicants; and,

WHEREAS, there are ten private preschool providers in Cape May County, and this represents evidence of high demand; and,

NOW THEREFORE be it resolved that the Upper Township Board of Education seeks relief from 18A:7F.45 to maintain and expand its preschool program.
