# Mask Survey Results

- FAMILIES: 82% masks optional, 18% masks required
- STAFF: 85% masks optional, 15% masks required
- BOE: 88% masks optional, 12% masks required
- ADMIN: 100% masks optional, 0% masks required



- **<u>PARENTS/GUARDIANS</u>** determine whether or not their children wear masks.
- Staff and students are <u>NOT REQUIRED</u> to wear masks in school/on school grounds.
- Students are **NOT REQUIRED** to wear masks on buses.



ANY Staff Member or Student is encouraged to wear a mask if he or she chooses to do so.

ANY student who makes it uncomfortable for a person choosing to wear a mask, or not wear a mask, will receive immediate disciplinary action.

### COVID-19 SYMPTOMS

**If TWO OR MORE SYMPTOMS** are present, students should **NOT** attend school until symptoms have subsided (Pre-Covid Status).

- 1. Chills.
- 2. Congestion/Runny Nose (not associated with known allergies).
- 3. Diarrhea.
- 4. Extreme Fatigue.
- 5. Headache (not associated with known allergies/conditions).
- 6. Multiple Body Aches.
- 7. Nausea/Vomiting.
- 8. Sore Throat.

### COVID-19 SYMPTOMS

<u>If ONE OR MORE SYMPTOMS</u> are present, students should <u>NOT</u> attend school until symptoms have subsided (Pre-Covid Status).

- 1. Fever of 100.4 or higher (24 hours fever-free).
- 2. Persistent Cough (not associated with known allergies).
- 3. Shortness of breath/Difficulty breathing.
- 4. New loss of taste or smell (COVID test strongly recommended).

### SYMPTOMATIC PEOPLE (Regardless of Vaccination Status)

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Symptomatic people who have been MEDICALLY DIAGNOSED with an illness other than COVID-19 DO NOT have to isolate (documentation required).

#### HAVE SYMPTOMS <u>AT SCHOOL</u> (Regardless of Vaccination Status)

Isolate for 5 days beginning the day AFTER symptoms start:

- a. If symptoms resolve or improve and fever-free for 24 hours, return to school on Day 6 (masks recommended for Days 6-10) (loss of taste or smell may last for weeks).
- b. If fever or symptoms have not improved, continue to isolate until fever-free and symptoms improved.
- c. If test and negative, return to school as soon as symptoms are no longer present and fever-free for 24 hours (loss of taste or smell may last for weeks).

#### NO SYMPTOMS and <u>TEST POSITIVE</u> (Regardless of Vaccination Status)

Isolate for 5 days beginning the day AFTER symptoms start:

- a. If NO symptoms develop, return to school on Day 6 (masks recommended for Days 6-10) (loss of taste or smell may last for weeks).
- b. If symptoms start within the 5 days of isolation, a new 5-day isolation period begins the day AFTER the day of symptoms.

### VACCINATED PEOPLE

Vaccinated people who come <u>within 3 feet</u> of someone who tests positive or has symptoms:

- 1. **<u>DO NOT</u>** have to quarantine:
  - a. Students 11 and under DO NOT need to be boosted, just fully vaccinated.
  - b. Students 12 and older and staff NEED to be boosted and full vaccinated.
- 2. SHOULD get tested on Day 6 after the last Close Contact (PCR test preferred).

## NON-VACCINATED PEOPLE

Non-vaccinated people who come <u>within 3 feet</u> of someone who tests positive or has symptoms:

- 1. Quarantine is **OPTIONAL.**
- 2. If you develop symptoms, isolate for at least 5 days beginning the day AFTER symptoms start:
  - a. If symptoms resolve or improve and fever-free for 24 hours, return to school on Day 6 (<u>masks recommended for Days 6-10</u>) (loss of taste or smell may last for weeks).
  - b. If fever or symptoms have not improved, continue to isolate until fever-free and symptoms improved.
  - c. If test and negative, return to school as soon as symptoms are no longer present and fever-free for 24 hours (loss of taste or smell may last for weeks).
- 3. SHOULD get tested on Day 6 after the last Close Contact (PCR test preferred).

## SCHOOL COMMUNICATIONS

1. If a child tests positive, identified students <u>less than 3ft apart</u> from that child will be notified:

a. If the identified student does not have symptoms, quarantine is <u>OPTIONAL</u>.

2. For identified students without symptoms, parents or guardians can keep students home during Days 1-10 and students will be treated as we do for required isolations (no penalty).

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
