Expectations for the 2021-2022 School Year

 Keep schools open ALL YEAR.
 Appropriately address all academic needs and non-strengths.
 Support the social and emotional health of staff and students.

What is Close Contact?

- Within 6 feet.
- For at least 15 minutes in a 24-hour period.
- Within 2 days prior to illness onset or a positive test result.
- Regardless of whether the contact was wearing a mask.

Vaccinated Close Contact

- If the Close Contact is exposed by a person who has tested positive or symptomatic:
 - 1. Recommended that the close contact is tested on Days 3-5 (not required).
 - 2. Close Contact <u>can remain at work/school</u>, with masks, <u>until symptomatic or tests positive</u>.

- If the Close Contact is exposed by a person who has tested **positive but is able to isolate away from the person**:
 - 1. Follow prescribed protocols.
 - 2. Close Contact, WITHOUT symptoms, is **<u>permitted to</u>** <u>**return to work/school:**</u>

a. On Days 8-10 with a (-) test taken on Days 5-7.b. On Day 11 if not tested.

- If the Close Contact is exposed by a person who has tested **positive but is NOT able to isolate away from the person**:
 - 1. Follow prescribed protocols.
 - 2. Close Contact, WITHOUT symptoms, is **<u>permitted to</u>** <u>**return to work/school:**</u>

a. On Days 18-20 with a (-) PCR test taken on Days 15-17.b. On Day 21 if not tested.

- If the Close Contact is exposed by a person who has **symptoms but is able to isolate away from the person**:
 - 1. Follow prescribed protocols.
 - 2. Close Contact, WITHOUT symptoms, is **<u>permitted to</u>** <u>**return to work/school:**</u>

a. After sick person produces a (-) test.b. On Days 8-10 with a (-) test taken on Days 5-7.c. On Day 11 if not tested.

- If the Close Contact is exposed by a person who has symptoms but is NOT able to isolate away from the person:
 - 1. Follow prescribed protocols.
 - 2. Close Contact, WITHOUT symptoms, is <u>permitted to</u> <u>return to work/school:</u>

a. After sick person produces a (-) PCR test.b. On Days 18-20 with a (-) PCR test taken on Days 15-17.c. On Day 21 if not tested.

- If the Close Contact is exposed by a person who has tested **positive but is able to isolate away from the person**:
 - 1. Follow prescribed protocols.
 - 2. Close Contact, WITHOUT symptoms, is **<u>permitted to</u>** <u>**return to work/school:**</u>

a. On Day 15 (no option to test out).

- Main benefit is to prevent the spreading of the virus.
- Cloth masks are breathable and freely diffuse carbon dioxide when breathing is present.
- The wearing of properly-fitted masks is the most effective mitigation strategy for staff/students.

MASKS

- CDC and AAP strongly recommend that ALL people in PK-12 schools properly wear masks.
- EO-251 mandates the wearing of masks in schools/school activities for ALL staff and students (regardless of vaccination status).
- ALL recommendations by a CSA must be in compliance with NJ State Law.

MASKS

ALL staff and students will wear a mask in school and on the bus <u>except</u>:

 During mask breaks.
 While outdoors.
 While eating or drinking.
 Performing, singing, participating in intense aerobic indoor activity.

Mask Non-Compliance

 Students will be given a mask to wear. If refuse to wear, students will be sent home (disciplinary event).

2. Further action may be taken in alignment with EO-251.

3. Outside agencies may be contacted.

Social Distancing

3 feet will be maintained to the <u>greatest extent</u> <u>possible</u> (some scenarios 1-3 ft):

Properly wearing of masks

Upgrades in ventilation systems

 COVID-19 Annual Statement of Assurance* (replaces daily screening forms)

What Will School Look Like? (Logistics)

- **1.** No more plastic barriers (except for special education cases).
- 2. MS students can use hallway lockers (limited basis).
- 3. MS students will NOT remain in cohorts (students will be scheduled by class period and move from room to room. * (replaces cohorts that remained together all day)
- 4. Activities/sports/assemblies are back (with social distancing).

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Decks face same direction. (limited groupwork normitted)

What Will School Look Like? (Hand washing/sanitizing)

Before/after lunch/snack.
 Before/after PE/Specials.*
 Before/after sharing of equipment.*
 Before/after switching rooms.*

 * (when applicable)

What Will School Look Like? (Lunch)

1. 3 ft min of social distancing.

2. Masks off only while eating/drinking.

3. Assigned seats within each cohort.

What Will School Look Like? (When required to isolate: COVID-related)

1. Students will have access to all materials (entire length of isolation).

2. Day 6 through isolation: ageappropriate, synchronous academic support (up to 1 hour per day).

3. Students will NOT be marked absent.

Testing Protocols (Staff)

- NJDOH will be offering a FREE testing program for ALL school employees (specifics to be released by mid-September).
- Vaccinated staff will NOT be required to submit weekly test results (as of today).
- Non-vaccinated staff WILL be required to submit weekly test results (DOH to release a list of acceptable tests in the near future).

Testing Protocols (Staff)

- ALL non-vaccinated staff need to submit weekly test results: no testing exemptions for medical/religious situations.
- Home test results ARE permitted and can be officially submitted and deemed compliant.
- Our nurses will NOT be involved in testing at our schools at this point in time.

Testing Protocols (Staff)

- Staff may submit test results from ANY of the approved testing kits/sites (not yet available from the DOH).
- If a staff member chooses NOT to participate in the FREE program, they are financially responsible for alternative testing.
- ALL substitute staff MUST be vaccinated to remain active on our sub lists (Long-Term subs will be treated as Staff for testing purposes).

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
