






What is Preschool Expansion Aid?

• State aid provided via application- once a district receives it, it will always have it




Purpose is to expand to full preschool "universe" over 5 years
 (universe = 2 x # students in 1st grade)

• Lots of requirements come along with receiving the aid

• What does this mean in UTSD?

For 2024-25, we will have 3 or 4 inclusion classrooms,
 which meas anywhere from 33-44 spaces for regular
 education students







Preschool Classroom Requirements

Each Classroom Has:

1 P-3 Certified Classroom Teacher

1 Classroom Aide

Maximum of 15 students (mix of general education and special

education)



Preschool Instructional Coach (shared)

• The PIC coaches teachers on the development of pedagogy and practice to affect student outcomes

Preschool Intervention Referral Team (PIRT)

• PIRT team members coach teachers on the development of social-emotional practice to affect student outcomes.





Preschool Day and

Curriculum

Requirements:

- 6 hour day
- Transportation provided
- Follows school district calendar

Attendance Counts!

- Students are expected to attend every day, unless they are ill.
- Research shows that missing 10% or more of school, even during preschool years, can impact students' skills for reading readiness and academic performance in later years.

Sample Daily Schedule

 Arrival and choice activities: 	30 Minutes
• Group Meeting:	20 Minutes

• Choice Time: 60 Minutes

• Clean Up, Hand-washing, Snack: 20 Minutes

• Small Groups: 20 Minutes

• Outdoor Choice Time: 40 Minutes

• Read Aloud: 15 minutes

• Lunch: 40 Minutes

• Rest/Quiet Activities: 45 minutes

• Outdoor Choice Time: 30 minutes

• Read Aloud: 15 Minutes

• Limited Choice/Small Groups: 30 Minutes

• Group Meeting/Departures: 20 Minutes

A typical preschool day contains a balance of small and large group activities including fine and gross motor skill development, student choice work, and ample time for daily routines




The Creative Curriculum

Research- Based Program


- One of four state-approved preschool curriculum

Curriculum Goal

To help children acquire a set of skills in 10 key areas of development which set a pathway of learning across the childhood years:

- Social-emotional
- language
- literacy
- physical
- the arts
- English language acquisition
- mathematics
- cognitive
- science and technology
- social studies

Registration Process

Application

- In-person (only option) application for the lottery will take place from 3/11 3/15
- Forms available in Primary School lobby from 8:45am 4:15 pm, daily
- Any applications completed after
 4:15 pm on March 15 will
 automatically go on the waitlist

Lottery

- In-person lotteryMonday, March 25, 6:30PM in the Primary School
- A representative for the child must be present
- A lottery will be held for
 3 year old slots, 4 year
 old slots and the waiting
 list.

Registration

- Once lottery is complete and we know which students have been accepted, you will then receive registration instructions.
- If your child is selected for an open spot and you decide you do not want them to attend for the 24-25 school year, please notify us ASAP so we can contact the first person on the waiting list














Requirements for Application/Registration

- Children MUST be three years old but not five years old by 10/1/2024
- Children will need to be up-to-date on immunizations
- Children will be expected to attend full-day, every day unless sick
 - There is no half day option
 - Students whose attendance is not satisfactory will be removed from the program to open a spot for another student





Special Considerations

- Twin siblings will be given priority- however twins must have been picked in lottery by the second-to-last draw in order for both to be accepted
- If one of a set of twins is chosen as the last available spot, only that sibling will be offered a spot
- Siblings who are 3 and 4 (both in preschool) will be given priority- same as twins
- If a 4-year-old student is currently enrolled in preschool and has a 3-year-old sibling, the 3-year -old sibling will be given priority.
- No other sibling priority given (i.e. a child of any other age/grade level enrolled in district)
